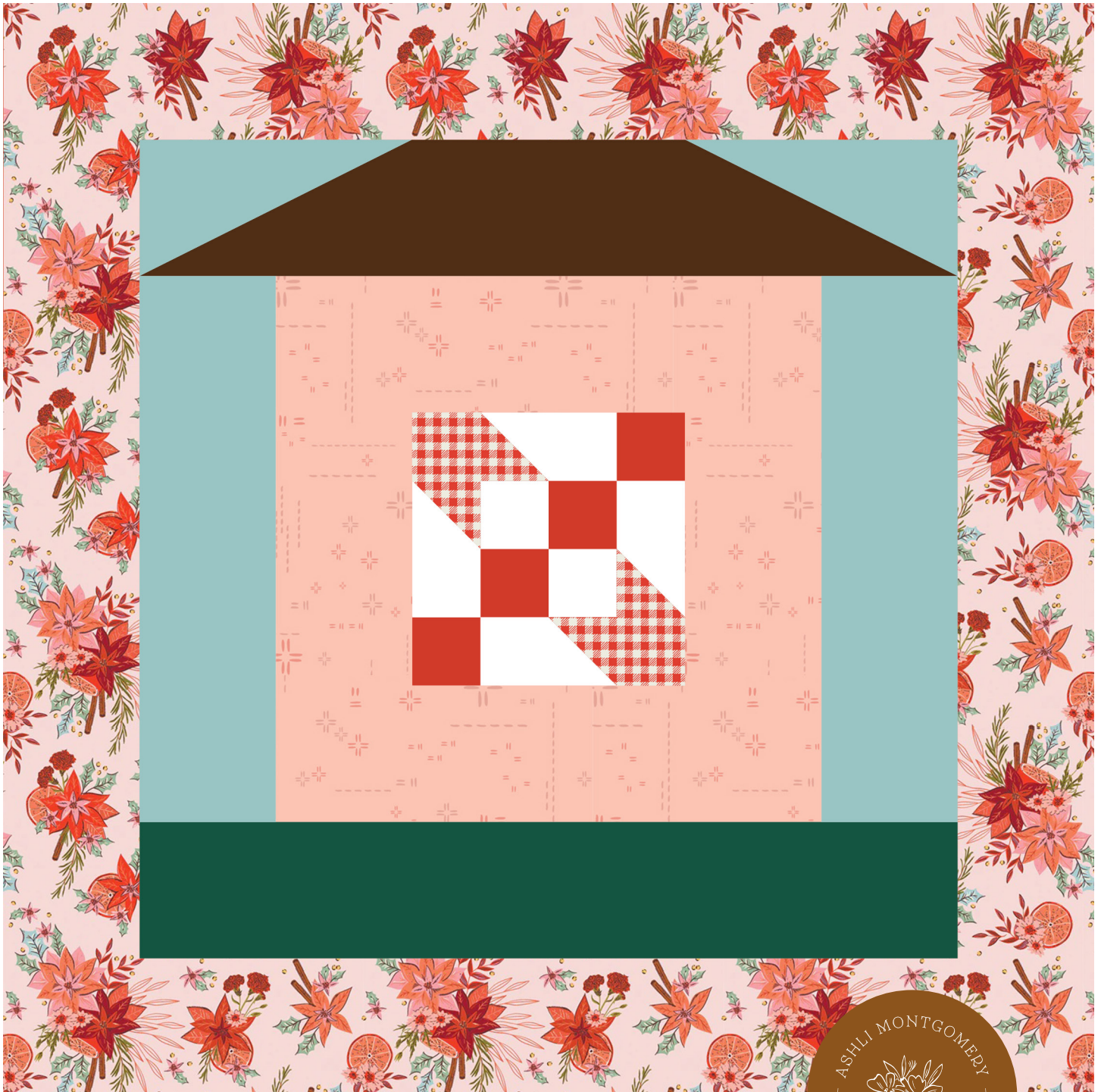


Green Hills Quilt Collection

Back of the Barn

Imagine an afternoon drive through the country roads outside Green Hills on a crisp winter day. Snow patches reflect the sun's golden rays, horses frolic in the pastures, and every barn boasts a beautiful quilt block, painted in bold, vibrant colors.

That vision is my inspiration for Back of the Barn, a traditionally pieced house block with a twist: it features a staple on many barns across America. The barn quilt can be a miniature version of any block; this pattern uses the Road to Oklahoma with holiday fabrics from AGF Studio's 2025 "Christmas in the Cabin" collection.

Use a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance throughout | HST = Half Square Triangle

MATERIALS & CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

	Yuletide Blossoms	 Fabric A	• (2), 2" x 12½" rectangles • (2), 2" x 9½" rectangles
	Peacock	 Fabric B	• (1), 2" x 9½" rectangle
	Coffee Bean	 Fabric C	• (1), 11⅛" x 2" rectangle
	Morning Frost	 Fabric D	• (2), 6½" x 2" rectangles • (2), 4⅝" x 2⅛" rectangles
	Peach Whisper	 Fabric E	• (2), 6½" x 2" rectangles • (2), 3½" x 2" rectangles
	Checkered Charm	 Fabric F	• (2), 1¼" x 1¼" squares • (2), 1¼" x 1¼" squares
	London Red	 Fabric G	• (4), 1¼" x 1¼" squares
	Snow	 Fabric H	• (2), 1¼" x 1¼" squares • (6), 1¼" x 1¼" squares

Create Road to Oklahoma Miniature Barn Quilt

1. With a pencil, draw a diagonal line on the back of each $1\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric H square.
2. Stack one $1\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric H square square on one $1\frac{3}{4}$ " Fabric F square, right sides together.
3. Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " on either side of the pencil line.
4. Cut along the diagonal line and press each unit towards the darker fabric.
5. Trim each HST to $1\frac{1}{4}$ " square.
6. Repeat to make a total of (4) HST units.
7. Using (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric F square, (1) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric H square, and (2) HST units, layout as shown in figure 1 and sew together.
8. Make (2) of these.
9. Using (2) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric G squares and (2) $1\frac{1}{4}$ " Fabric H squares, layout as shown in figure 2 and sew together.
10. Make (2) of these.
11. Layout all (4) four-patch units as shown in figure 3 and sew together to complete the featured miniature quilt block.

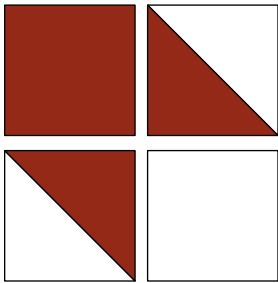

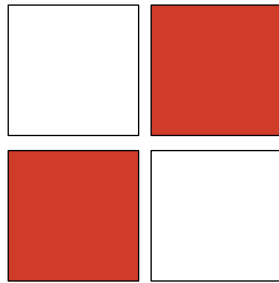

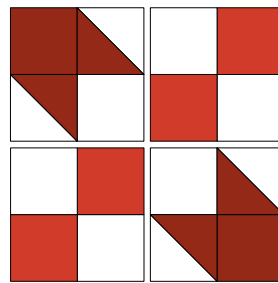

Build the Barn

1. As shown in figure 4:
Sew (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" Fabric E rectangle on each side of the miniature barn. Then sew (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" Fabric E rectangle on the top and bottom of the unit.
2. As shown in figure 5:
Sew (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" Fabric D rectangle on each side of the unit. Then Sew (1) $9\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2" Fabric B rectangle on the bottom of the barn.

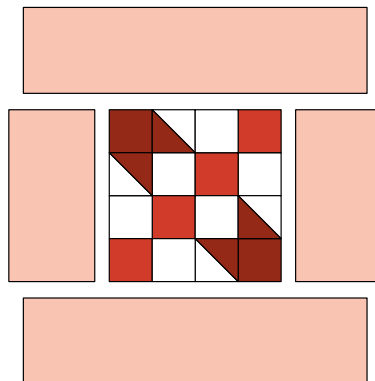

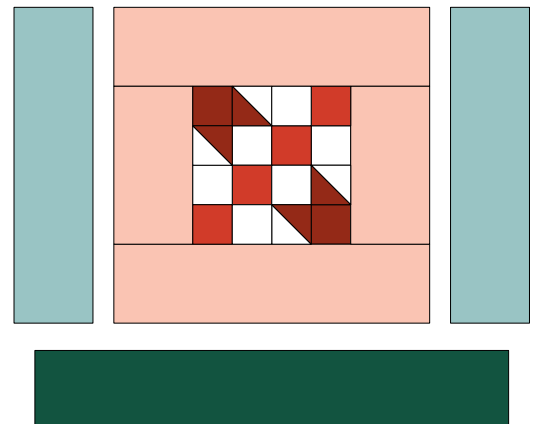

3. To construct the roof, draw a diagonal line from lower left to upper right corner on (1) $4\frac{5}{16}" \times 2\frac{1}{8}"$ Fabric D rectangle. On the other Fabric D rectangle, draw the diagonal line from upper left to lower right corner as shown in figure 6.

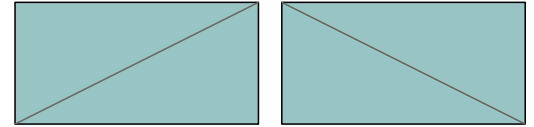

4. Cut on each diagonal line.
5. Use one Fabric D triangle from each cut as a template to trim the upper right and upper left corners from the $11\frac{1}{8}" \times 2"$ Fabric C rectangle.
6. With right sides together, sew the Fabric D template triangles onto the Fabric C unit. Press corners and trim to a $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 2"$ rectangle as shown in figure 7.

7. Sew roof unit onto barn as shown in figure 8.
8. As shown in figure 9: Sew (1) $9\frac{1}{2}" \times 2"$ Fabric A rectangle onto each side of the barn unit. Then sew (1) $12\frac{1}{2}" \times 2"$ Fabric A rectangle onto the top and the bottom of the barn unit to complete the block.

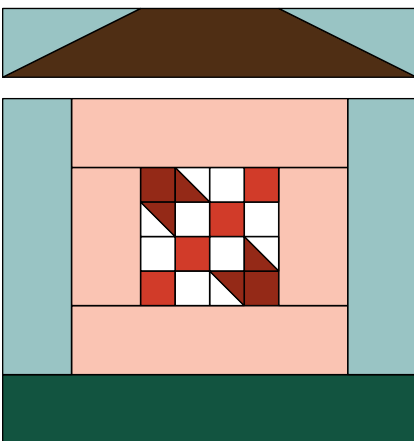

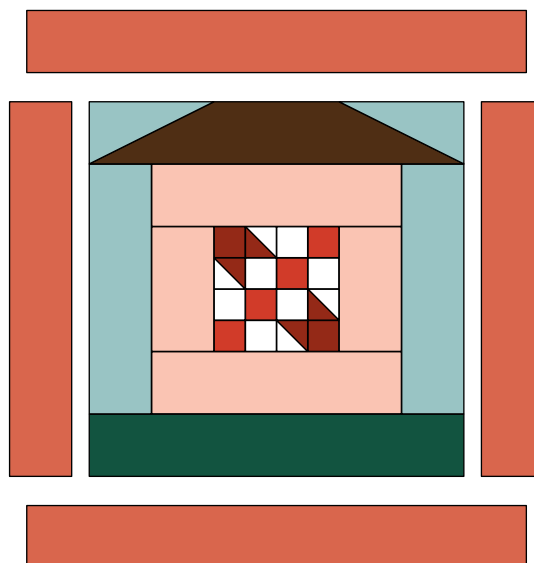
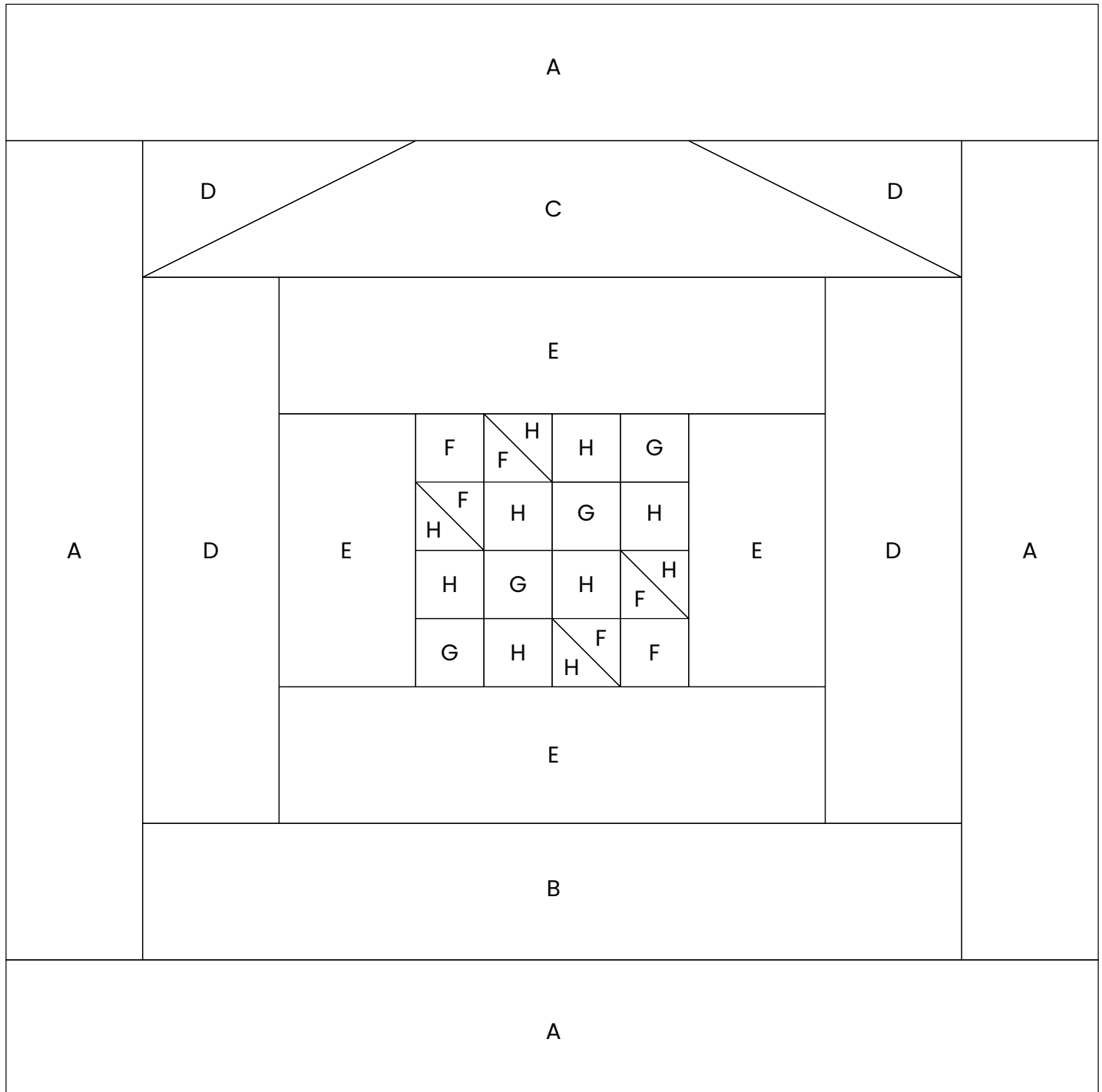
