Honey Butter

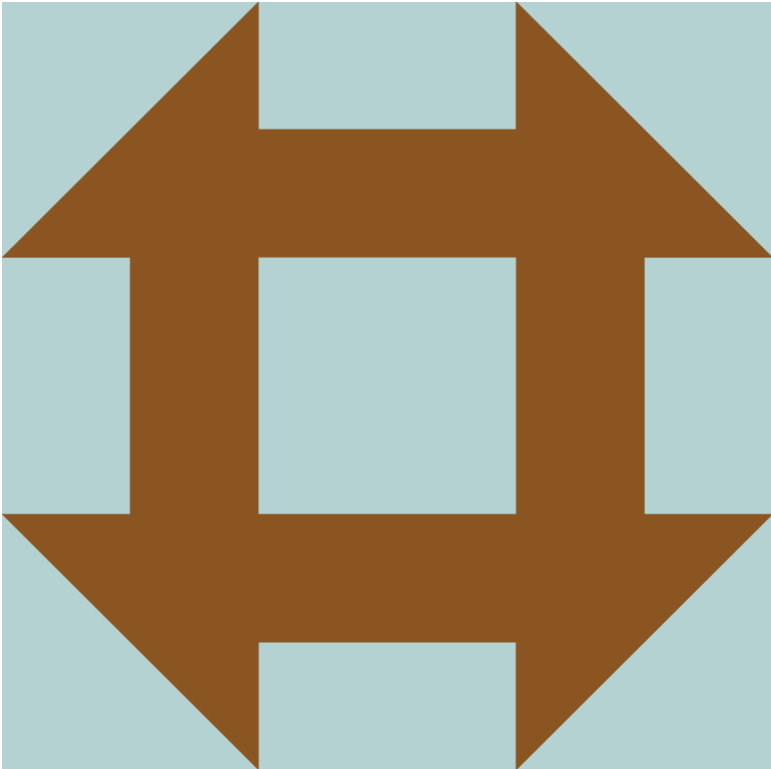
Finished Block: 12" x 12" | Unfinished Block: 12.5" x 12.5"

Timeless block patterns remain popular for centuries for a reason. They are crisp, easy to construct, and play well with others!

The Churn Dash is one of those designs that never goes out of style.

The Honey Butter quilt block is a fun spin on the traditional nine-patch Churn Dash block, which is also commonly called the Monkey Wrench pattern.

When you look at the background pinwheel, imagine pouring fresh honey into a butter churn to create a sweet and delicious treat for home-baked bread, roasted corn, or stirred into mashed sweet potatoes — yum!



Traditional Churn Dash Pattern

MATERIALS & CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS	
Fabric A (Peach)	- o (4), 5½" x 5½" squares - o (2), 3" x 3" squares - o (4), 2½" x 2½" squares
Fabric B (Parchment)	- o (4), 5½" x 5½" squares - o (2), 3" x 3" squares - o (4), 2½" x 2½" squares
Fabric C (Green)	- o (4), 5" x 5" squares - o (4), 4½" x 2½" rectangles

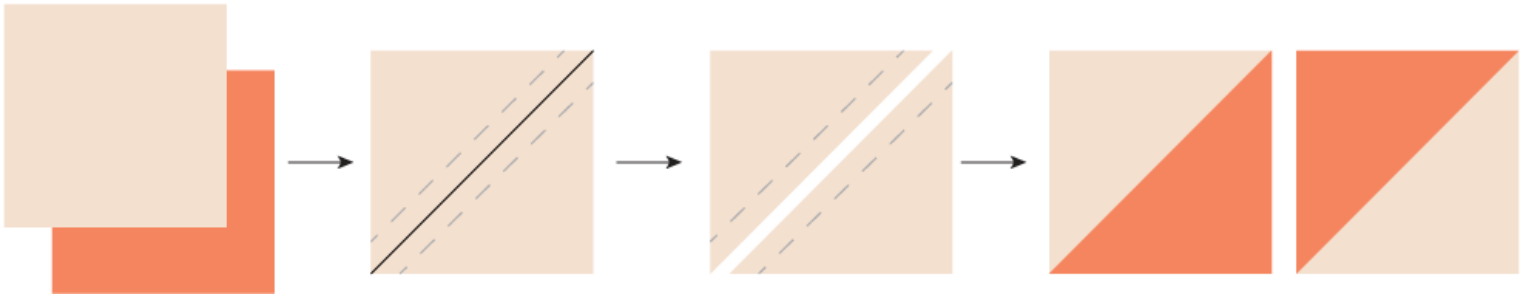
Use a scant ¼" seam allowance throughout. | Stitch right sides together.



Assemble Half-Square Triangles

Use the "2-at-a-time HST" method to create A/B half-square triangles:

1. Gather 2 squares, one in each fabric.
2. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of one square.
3. Place squares RST.
4. Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " on either side of the drawn line.
5. Cut along the drawn line to create 2 identical HST units.
6. Press seams open or toward the darker fabric as desired.
7. Trim HSTs to the specified size.

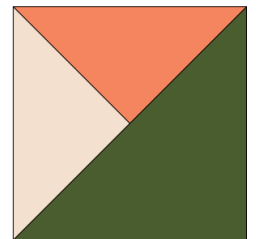


Use (2) 3" Fabric A squares and (2) 3" Fabric B squares to create (4) A/B HSTs, trimmed to $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Set aside for the center unit.

Use (4) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A squares and (4) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B squares to create (8) A/B HSTs, trimmed to 5" square.

Use (4) of the 5" A/B HSTs and (4) 5" Fabric C squares to create (4) A/B/C Quarter-Square Triangles. Trim to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

NOTE: There are (4) A/B HSTs leftover; they are the mirror placement of the (4) you need to ensure that Fabric B is always to the left of Fabric A as shown.



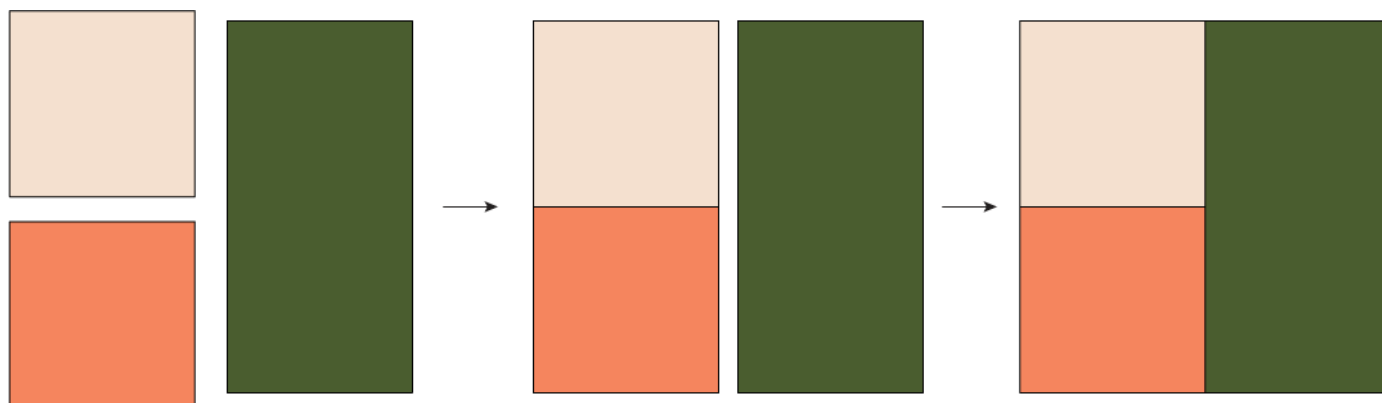
Assemble Center Unit

Use the (4) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " A/B HSTs to create the center unit as show. Trim to $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square.



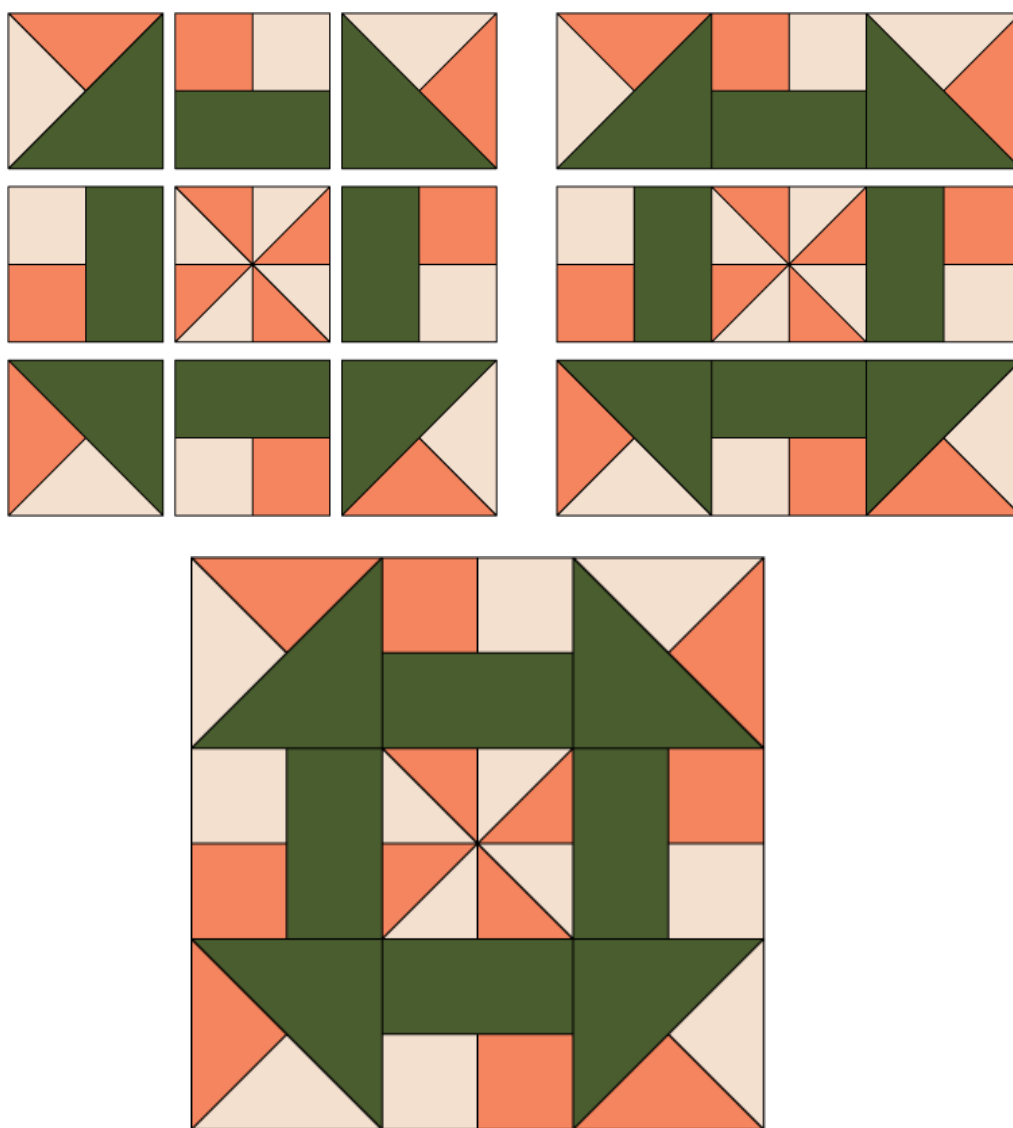
Assemble Middle Units

Use (1) 2½" Fabric A square and (1) 2½" Fabric B square and (1) Fabric C rectangle to create a 4½" middle unit. Repeat to make (4) total.

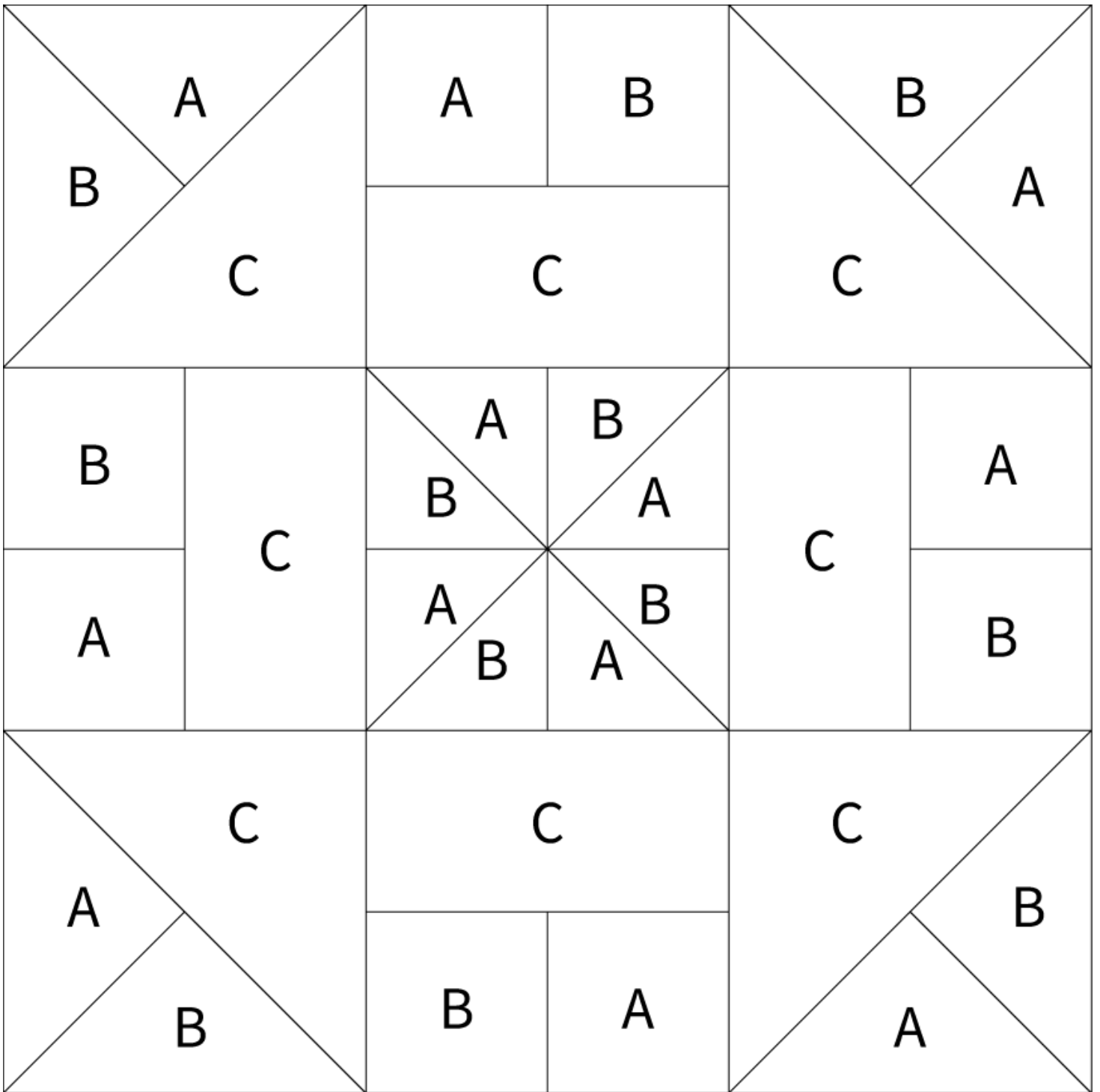


Assemble Honey Butter Quilt Block

Arrange the nine patch units as shown. Sew top row, middle row, and bottom row; then sew the three rows together to complete the block.
